Evergaz and semi-public company (SEM) Oise Energies Renouvelables join forces to develop NGV/BioNGV stations by creating the Mobilités Vertes de l'Oise Company

Thourotte, 07 September 2021,

Evergaz, one of France's leading biogas companies for more than 12 years, and *Société d'Economie Mixte* (SEM or semi-public company) Oise Energies Renouvelables, owned by SEZEO (Syndicat des Énergies Zone Est de l'OISE) and SICAE OISE (electricity distributor and supplier operating in 235 municipalities), have announced the launch of the Mobilités Vertes de l'Oise Company.

The objective of this simplified joint stock company under French law is to develop, build and operate public NGV/BioNGV stations open to all types of customers and vehicles in the Hauts-de-France region.

With this initiative, Mobilités Vertes de l'Oise illustrates the complementarity of public and private players in developing Natural Gas for Vehicles on French territory and making a successful ecological transition in the transportation sector.

A project already well under way

Mobilités Vertes de l'Oise will initially set up 6 NGV/BioNGV stations by 2023. As such, since February 2020, preliminary research in conjunction with local players has already resulted in the selection of 6 strategic locations for vehicle flows, ensuring optimal territorial coverage. The company is already working on the construction of a NGV/BioNGV station for each of these locations. These first 6 stations will be situated in the Oise and Aisne departments, and in the medium term some of them will provide other forms of energy such as hydrogen and electric superchargers. At operational level, they will be developed in conjunction with the Energies Renouvelables SEM and Evergaz, a French biogas producer that already operates NGV/BioNGV stations and is one of the partners-shareholders in the Seven Occitanie project, which develops a network of 20 BioNGV stations in the Occitanie region.

Stations

More specifically, the six locations selected by Mobilités Vertes de l'Oise are located in:

- Compiègne (60200)
- Longueil Sainte Marie (60126)
- Laigneville (60290)
- Ressons sur Matz (60490)
- Noyon (60400)
- Soissons (02200)

These stations will be public and open to all types of customers and vehicles such as lorries, buses, bin lorries, light commercial vehicles and light-duty vehicles. These stations, open 24/7, will provide users with a choice of CNG (Compressed Natural Gas) or BioCNG (Compressed Natural Gas from the anaerobic digestion of organic matter), in the form of two quick dispensers. In terms of design, all critical equipment in the stations will be backed up, thus guaranteeing a 100% availability rate. The stations will accept various means of payment (EVERGAZ card, Credit/debit card, etc.). The **opening of the first stations is scheduled for 2022,** in particular in Compiègne for the first one.









Focus on

The Compiègne NGV/BIONGV station (2 islands/3 tracks)

This NGV/BIONGV station is the most advanced project. It is scheduled to open in the first half of 2022. It is ideally located near the N31 (Beauvais-Soissons road) and the warehouses of future customers.

An energy of the future in a fast-changing sector

As Natural Gas for Vehicles is now recognised as one of the pillars of ecological transition in transportation and is currently booming, the PPE (multi-annual energy programme) expects that 60% of lorries will run on NGV in 2050. As a result, local authorities, NGV operators and carriers are joining forces on the ground to drive the conversion of private and public fleets and promote low-carbon mobility. This complementarity between local authorities and private businesses is critical to developing the market, the growth of which simultaneously relies on the creation of new stations and the use of new NGV vehicles. With 80% less CO₂, 95% less fine particles and 50% less NOx (nitrogen dioxide) emitted than diesel, and a lower cost than diesel, BioNGV is the fuel of the future. As France's leading biogas operator, Evergaz stands firm in its commitment to the ecological transition of the transport sector, alongside local authorities and private carriers, with this investment in the Oise and Aisne departments in partnership with SEZEO and SICAE Oise.

This territorial project is in keeping with the process initiated by public authorities to decarbonise the road transport sector, which must adapt to the regulatory provisions featured in particular in the French laws on Climate and Resilience (2021) and Mobility Orientation (2019). This new network, which will be installed just outside Paris and its Low-emission Zone, will contribute to the economic competitiveness of its customers, who will meet their delivery commitments while continuing to combat climate change.

"This partnership is a tangible example of Oise Énergies Renouvelables SEM's investments in energy transition. All local players were of course consulted on these matters relating to land use planning and economic development", says Olivier FERREIRA, CEO of the Oise Énergies Renouvelables SEM.

"This cooperation reflects the territorial grounding of Evergaz's action: we are convinced of the environmental and economic benefit of biogas production for local stakeholders – farmers, industrial companies and local authorities. With NGV/BioNGV, biogas provides carriers and local authorities with a source of green energy and plays a major role in the ecological transformation of our lifestyles", says Frédéric FLIPO, Deputy CEO of Evergaz.
